# Tru-Catch Traps

## Setting & Baiting



### *Setting Your Trap:-*

1. Using your index fingers, raise both rings to the top of the door.
2. Use your middle finger to flip open and raise the door.
3. With your right hand, set the door on a variable trigger setting. You can adjust the trigger rod by moving it down, this will create a sensitive setting for lighter animals.
4. Your trap is now set and ready to bait.
5. If your trap has a rear door, secure it with the carabineer that comes with the trap.

### *Baiting Your Trap:-*

Place a small amount of bait approximately 3 to 4 feet in front of the trap and again approximately 1 foot in front of the trap, and then a small amount just inside the trap door and a spoonful just behind the trip plate.

To release an unwanted animal from your trap, simply use the rear release door on the "D" models or turn the trap over if it is a single door trap (the door will automatically open for release).

### *Bait List:-*

- Armadillo—Meal worms, maggots, sardines or fish
- Birds—sunflower seeds or scratch grain
- Bobcat—Offal or fish
- Cat—fish or meats
- Chipmunks/Squirrels—prune pits, unroasted peanuts, corn, peanut butter
- Coyote—Freezer burnt game meat, fresh mice or rotten eggs
- Dogs—dog food or cooked meats
- Rabbits—fresh vegetables or trying spraying the inside of the trap with apple cider. In winter use bread.
- Raccoon—marshmallows, canned tuna, raw/cooked/smoked fish, fruit, peanut butter
- Skunk—Chicken entrails, fresh or canned fish, crisp bacon or cat food
